## Cathodoluminescent UV Sources for Air Disinfection Applications

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Cathodoluminescent UV-light (peaked at 315 nm and 355 nm ) sources have been created using commercially available phosphors, with photocatalytic activity observed at irradiation of titanium dioxide. The power density of UV radiation is higher than 10 $\mathrm{mW} / \mathrm{cm} 2$. The photocatalytic efficiency was estimated by measuring the oxidation rate of acetone vapors (reaction rate exceeds $2 \mathrm{ppm} / \mathrm{min}$ ).
