## Comparative Study of the Level of Awareness of E-Waste Management in Romania and Republic of Moldova

*Abstract*— The paper focuses on the management of the ewaste and, based on a comparative analysis of the level of awareness of the danger of the improper disposal of them, in Romania and the Republic of Moldova.
