The paper reviews the need of customs control for dual-use goods and services, including those that belong to medicine, pharmaceuticals, and micro-nanoelectronics. The guide is intended for customs service employees, responsible government agencies, universities, academic institutions and relevant business communities involved in international trade of strategic goods.
